STATE OF MAINE

RESOLVE in aid of navigation on the waters of Duck Pond,
in Cumberland County, State of Maine.

Resolved, That the sum of three hundred dollars be and
2 hereby is appropriated to aid in the navigation on the waters
3 of Duck pond in the towns of South Windham, Falmouth
4 and the city of Westbrook in the county of Cumberland,
5 state of Maine.

STATEMENT OF FACTS.

During the past three years, the cottagers, land owners and all-the-year-round residents of Duck Pond have organized the Duck Pond Improvement Association with a membership of nearly a hundred and representing all the summer and native residents in the vicinity of this pond. The association has built a wharf in the pond, screened the brook and has planned other improvements.

Duck Pond has several dangerous rocks and a bad channel near the outlet which has to be used by every person visiting the place. It is to have the rocks marked with buoys and the channel cleared that the above-named appropriation of three hundred dollars is asked of the 76th Legislature.
