## STATE OF MAINE

# IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND NINE HUNDRED AND THIRTEEN.

AN ACT additional to sections 96, 97 and 98 of chapter 49 of the Revised Statutes relating to the qualifications of insurance agents and brokers.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

Section 1. Before an agent or broker is licensed as pro-2 vided in sections ninety-six, ninety-seven and ninety-eight

- 3 of chapter forty-nine of the revised statutes he shall file
- 4 with the insurance commissioner a statement under oath,
- 5 giving his name, residence, present occupation, his occupa-
- 6 tion for the five years next preceding the date of such state-
- 7 ment and such other information, if any, as the insurance

8 commissioner may require. After filing the statement 9 herein provided the insurance commissioner may, if he is 10 satisfied that the appointee is a suitable person, issue to 11 him a license in accordane with said sections ninety-six, 12 ninety-seven and ninety-eight of chapter forty-nine of the 13 revised statutes provided, however, that it shall not be 14 necessary for an applicant qualifying as an agent or broker 15 for any particular company to re-qualify. The insurance 16 commissioner may at any time after the granting of such 17 license, for cause shown, and after a hearing, determine any 18 person so appointed, or any person theretofore appointed 19 as agent, to be unsuitable to act as such agent, and shall 20 thereupon revoke such license and notify both the company 21 and the agent of such revocation.
