STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND NINE
HUNDRED AND THIRTEEN.

AN ACT relating to the compensation of County Commissioners.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

Section 1. Chapter one hundred and seventeen of the
2 Public Laws of nineteen hundred and five is hereby amend-
3 ed by striking out in the fifth line of Section one of said
4 chapter the words: One thousand fifty dollars and substi-
5 tuting therefor the words fourteen hundred dollars. So
o that the section as amended shall read as follows:

'Section 1. The annual salary for each county commis-
8 sioner for the several counties, shall be as follows:

Androscoggin, six hundred dollars.

Aroostook, eleven hundred dollars.

Cumberland, fourteen hundred dollars.

Franklin, three hundred and fifty dollars.

Hancock, seven hundred and fifty dollars.

Kennebec, one thousand dollars.

Knox, three hundred dollars.

Lincoln, three hundred dollars.

Oxford, five hundred dollars.

Penobscot, twelve hundred dollars.

Piscataquis, five hundred dollars.

Sagadahoc, two hundred and fifty dollars.

Somerset, six hundred and fifty dollars.

Waldo, four hundred dollars.

Washington, five hundred and fifty dollars.

York, seven hundred and fifty dollars.

Said salaries are payable from the county treasuries in
26 quarterly payments on the first days of January, April,
27 July and October of each year, in full for all services, ex-
28 penses and travel including the management of the jail
29 workshops and the sale of their products, except actual
30 necessary cash expenses incurred outside of their respective
31 counties for the transaction of official business; all bills for
32 such expenses shall be approved by the clerk or courts and
33 the county attorney of their county.
