## STATE OF MAINE

RESOLVE, authorizing the Highway Commissioner to construct a suitable office or shelter for the Immigrant Inspector at Van Buren, Maine.

Whereas the construction of an office or shelter for the immigrant inspector at Van Buren is a matter of immediate necessity in order to insure proper shelter and protection for the immigrant inspector stationed at this point against the inclemencies of the weather during the winter season.

And whereas, in the opinion of the legislature these facts constitute this resolve an emergency measure and the passage of the same immediately necessary for the preservation of public peace, health and safety.

Now therefore be it

Resolved: That the highway commissioner be and hereby is authorized and directed to cause to be constructed immedi-

3 ately a suitable office or shelter for the immigrant inspector 4 at Van Buren, county of Aroostook, at or near the interna-5 tional bridge, between Van Buren and St. Leonards, New 6 Brunswick, at an expense not to exceed five hundred dol-

7 lars, and that there be appropriated the sum of five hundred

8 dollars for that purpose.
