STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND NINE HUNDRED AND THIRTEEN.

AN ACT to amend chapter 153 of the Private and Special Laws of the year of 1903 relating to the Old Town Municipal Court.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

Section 1. Section 4 of Chapter 153 of the Private and 2 Special Laws of the year of 1903 is hereby amended so that, 3 as amended, the same shall read as follows:

'Sect. 4. Said court shall have original and exclusive jur-5 isdiction as follows: First, of all cases of forcible entry

6 and detainer respecting estates within the city of Old Town

7 or either of the towns of Milford, Bradley, Alton, Argyle,

8 Greenbush, Greenfield, Passadumkeag, Edinburg, Enfield,

9 Lowell, Burlington, Lincoln, and Lee, in said county of Pe-10 nobscot; second, of all such criminal offenses and misde-11 meanors committeed in said city or either of said towns as 12 are within the jurisdiction of trial justices. Third, of all 13 offenses against the ordinances and by-laws of said city or 14 either of said towns. Fourth, said court shall have original 15 jurisdiction concurrent with trial justices in all such mat-16 ters, civil or criminal, within the county of Penobscot, as 17 are by law within the jurisdiction of trial justices within 18 said county and are not placed within the exclusive juris-10 diction of said court by this section, and in all such civil 20 matters, excepting, however, actions of forcible entry and 21 detainer respecting estates within the city of Bangor, the 22 said court shall have jurisdiction though either party in-23 terested, or a person summoned as trustee, resides in said 24 city of Bangor.'

Sect. 2. Section 8 of said Chapter 153 is hereby amended 2 so that, as amended, the same shall read as follows:

'Sect. 8. A term of said court shall be held for the trans-4 action of civil business on the third Tuesday of each month, 5 excepting the month of October, beginning at ten hours of 6 the clock in the forenoon. Said court shall also be held on 7 every Tuesday at the usual hour for the purpose of filing 8 pleas in abatement, the motion mentioned in section eigh-9 teen of this act and for the entry and trial of actions of 10 forcible entry and detainer and such actions shall be re-11 turnable accordingly and be heard and judgment entered 12 therein on the return day of the writ unless continued for 13 good couse. For the cognizance and trial of criminal cases, 14 and for the entry, hearing and determination of petitions 15 under the provisions of chapter forty-two of the public laws 16 enacted in the year of nineteen hundred and seven, as 17 amended, said court shall be considered as in constant session. In all cases said court may be adjourned from time 19 to time.

Sect. 3. Section 9 of said chapter is hereby amended so 2 that, as amended, the same shall read as follows:

'Sect. 9. Said court shall be held at such place as the city 4 of Old Town shall provide and said city shall have power 5 and it shall be its duty to raise money to provide a proper 6 place for said court and its officers and suitably furnish, 7 warm and light the same. Sessions of said court for the 8 transaction of either civil or criminal business, or both, may, 9 in the discretion of the judge of said court, be held in the 10 town of Lincoln, in said county, and said town of Lincoln 11 shall have power to provide a proper place in which to hold 12 such sessions of said court, and suitably furnish and equip 13 the same. The salary of the judge of said court is hereby 14 fixed at one thousand five hundred dollars, annually; that 15 of the recorder is hereby fixed at seven hundred dollars, 16 annually, and both of said salaries are to be paid quarterly, 17 with all other expenses of said court, from the treasury of 18 the county of Penobscot.'
