STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND NINE
HUNDRED AND THIRTEEN.

AN ACT to forbid the clipping of horses during the winter
months.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

Section 1. No person shall clip any horse between the
2 first day of November and the first day of April, within the
3 State of Maine.

Sect. 2. Whoever violates the provisions of this act may
2 be punished by a fine not exceeding twenty-five dollars, or
3 by imprisonment in the county jail for not more than thirty
4 days. The judges of municipal courts and trial justices
5 shall have jurisdiction in offences under this Act.
