## STATE OF MAINE

The Committee on Salaries and Fees, which was instructed by an Order of the Legislature to inquire into the expediency of appointing a special committee to sit during the recess and after adjournment of the present session, and to inquire into the amount of compensation received by all state and county officers, whose salaries are determinable by the Legislature, and to report to the next Legislature such amounts as will make the salaries of such officers equitable throughout the state, have had the same under consideration, and ask leave to report the accompanying Order relating to salaries of officers.

#### STATE OF MAINE.

In Senate, February 12, 1913.

Ordered, That a special joint committee of three on the 2 part of the Senate and four on the part of the House, be 3 appointed to inquire into the amount of compensation and 4 services rendered by all state and county officials whose 5 salaries are determinable by the Legislature. Said committee is hereby authorized to sit during any recess and 7 after the adjournment of the present session, with full 8 power to employ a stenographer, summon, administer oaths 9 to and examine witnesses, call for books and papers, and in 10 general to obtain all necessary information upon which may 11 be based legislative action looking towards equalization of 12 salaries, and report in writing their findings and recommon 13 mendations, which report shall be filed with the clerk of the 14 House not later than December 1, 1914, and be referred to 15 the next Legislature without further action thereon.
