STATE OF MAINE

RESOLVE in favor of an appropriation to provide for participation by the State of Maine in the fiftieth anniversary exercises on the Battlefield of Gettysburg, Pennsylvania.

Resolved, That there be and hereby is appropriated the 2 sum of eighteen thousand dollars for the year nineteen hun-3 dred and thirteen to provide for participation by the state 4 of Maine in the exercises at Gettysburg, Pennsylvania, July 5 1st to 4th, inclusive, 1913, commemorating the fiftieth anni-6 versary of the battle of Gettysburg, the sum herein named 7 to be expended under the direction of the governor and 8 council who shall prescribe regulations under which free 9 transportation from their homes to Gettysburg and return, 10 together with necessary subsistence and medical attendance 11 en route to and from Gettysburg shall be furnished to all 12 persons now resident in Maine who participated in the battle 13 of Gettysburg.



STATEMENT OF FACTS.

There will be celebrated on July 1st-4th, 1913, under the auspices of the United States Government and the State of Pennsylvania, the 50th anniversary of the Battle of Gettysburg, upon the battlefield of Gettysburg. The United States Government will provide all necessary camp and garrison equipment, rations and supplies, for all visiting veterans of the Civil War, and many of the states have already provided for the transportation of all such veterans to and from their homes to this great national battlefield.
