# STATE OF MAINE

RESOLVE in favor of Indian Township for the repair of Roads and Bridges.

*Resolved*, That there be and hereby is appropriated the 2 sum of fifteen hundred dollars (\$1500) in the year 1913 3 and fifteen hundred dollars (\$1500) in the year 1914, for 4 the repair of roads and bridges in Indian Township in the 5 county of Washington; said appropriation to be expended 6 under the supervision of the State Highway Department.

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#### STATEMENT OF FACTS.

This is the main thoroughfare from many small towns to their chief market-town, Princeton, which has a population of nearly 1100 and a valuation of over \$300,000. Princeton is also the terminus of the Washington County Railroad. Over this road pass annually 80,000 bushels of potatoes. Estimated amount of lumber on this township 52,000,000 feet, and 7,000,-000 cords of wood.
