STATE OF MAINE

RESOLVE in favor of Indian Township for the repair of
Roads and Bridges.

*Resolved, That there be and hereby is appropriated the
2 sum of fifteen hundred dollars (\$1500) in the year 1913
3 and fifteen hundred dollars (\$1500) in the year 1914, for
4 the repair of roads and bridges in Indian Township in the
5 county of Washington; said appropriation to be expended
6 under the supervision of the State Highway Department.*



STATEMENT OF FACTS.

This is the main thoroughfare from many small towns to their chief market-town, Princeton, which has a population of nearly 1100 and a valuation of over \$300,000. Princeton is also the terminus of the Washington County Railroad. Over this road pass annually 80,000 bushels of potatoes. Estimated amount of lumber on this township 52,000,000 feet, and 7,000,000 cords of wood.
