### STATE OF MAINE

#### IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND NINE HUNDRED AND THIRTEEN.

AN ACT to amend section 71 of chapter 83 in regard to release or discharge of attachments.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:
Section I. Section seventy-one of Chapter eighty-three of
the Revised Statutes is hereby amended by adding at the
end of said section the following words:

Such attachment may be discharged on the record thereof 5 in the office of the Registry of Deeds by an Attorney-at-Law 6 authorized in writing by the plaintiff in such suit; *provided*, 7 *however*, that said writing is first recorded or filed in said 8 office, with a reference thereto made by the Register on the 9 margin of the record of the attachment,' so that said section, 10 as amended, shall read as follows:

'Sect. 71. When an attachment is dissolved by judgment 12 for the defendant, the clerk of the court shall give any per-13 son applying therefor a certificate of that fact, which the 14 register of deeds shall note on the margin of the record of 15 the attachment; and before or after judgment, the plaintiff 16 in such suit may cause a discharge of such attachment, 17 signed by him, to be entered on the margin of the record 18 thereof; or he may give a certificate, signed, sealed and ac-19 knowledged by him, that such attachment is, in whole or in 20 part, discharged; which the register of deeds shall record, 21 with a reference thereto on the margin of the record of the 22 attachment; such attachment may be discharged on the rec-23 ord thereof in the office of the Registry of Deeds by an At-24 torney-at-Law authorized in writing by the plaintiff in such 25 suit; provided, however, that said writing is first recorded 26 or filed in said office, with a reference thereto made by the 27 Register on the margin of the record of the attachment.'
