STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND NINE
HUNDRED AND THIRTEEN.

AN ACT to repeal Chapter 198 of the Public Laws of 1911, entitled "An Act relating to the compensation of justices of the Supreme Judicial or Superior Court," approved March 31, 1911, and to re-enact Chapter 58, Public Laws of 1909, as amended by Chapter 138, Public Laws of 1909.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

Section 1. Chapter 198 of the Public Laws of 1911, entitled "An Act relating to the Compensation of Justices of the Supreme Judicial or Superior Court," approved March 31, 1911, is hereby repealed.

Sect. 2. Chapter 58 of the Public Laws of 1909, entitled "An Act to provide for the compensation of Justices of the

3 Supreme Judicial or Superior Court who shall resign after
4 ten years' service at the age of 70 years," as amended by
5 chapter 132 of the Public Laws of the same year, is hereby
6 re-enacted, as follows:

 'Any justice of the supreme judicial court or superior court
8 who having attained the age of seventy years and having
9 served as such justice for at least ten consecutive years,
10 resigns his said office or ceases to serve at the expiration
11 of any term thereof, shall during the remainder of his life,
12 receive an amount equal to one-half of the salary which is
13 by law payable to him at the time of such resignation or
14 termination of service; to be paid by the State in the same
15 manner as the salaries of justices of said court are paid.
16 The provisions of this act shall apply to present and former
17 justices of said courts.'
