STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND NINE
HUNDRED AND THIRTEEN.

AN ACT to amend Section ninety-seven of Chapter fifteen of the Revised Statutes as amended relating to the appropriation for the schooling of children in unorganized townships.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

Section 1. Section ninety-seven of chapter fifteen of the
2 Revised Statutes as amended by chapter forty-five of the
3 Public Laws of nineteen hundred five, as amended by chap-
4 ter eighty-seven of the Public Laws of nineteen hundred
5 nine, as amended by chapter twenty-nine of the Public Laws
6 of nineteen hundred eleven, is hereby further amended by
7 striking out the word "eighteen" in the third line thereof

8 and substituting in place thereof the word 'twenty-three,'
9 so that said section when amended shall read as follows:

'Sect. 97. For the purpose of carrying out the provisions
11 of the three preceding sections, there is hereby appropriated
12 the sum of twenty-three thousand dollars annually, which
13 sum shall be deducted and set aside therefor by the treasurer
14 of state from the annual school funds of the state.'
