STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND NINE
HUNDRED AND THIRTEEN.

AN ACT to amend Section eight of Chapter one hundred and sixteen of the Revised Statutes, relating to transcripts in the Superior Court for Kennebec County.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

Section 1. Section eight of chapter one hundred and sixteen of the Revised Statutes is hereby amended, as follows:

3 By striking out the following words, "Kennebec, thirteen
4 hundred dollars a year, in full for all services and fees of
5 every kind. Whenever the stenographer of the superior
6 court of Kennebec county shall make or transcribe from
7 his notes any copies of the judge's charge or testimony of
8 witnesses, for parties calling for the same, he shall charge
9 the usual fees for such services to the party for whom he

10 renders these services, and certify the same to the clerk
11 of said court, and said clerk shall collect the same and pay
12 them over to the county treasurer;” and inserting in lieu
13 thereof the following: ‘Kennebec, thirteen hundred dollars
14 a year in full for all services chargeable by him to the coun-
15 ty;’ so that said section, as amended, shall read as follows:

‘Sect. 8. The salaries of the stenographers of the supe-
17 rior courts, to be paid quarterly from the treasuries of their
18 counties, are as follows:

‘Cumberland, fifteen hundred dollars a year, in full for all
20 services heretofore legally chargeable by him to the county.

‘Kennebec, thirteen hundred dollars a year in full for all
22 services chargeable by him to the county.’
