# IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND NINE HUNDRED AND THIRTEEN.

AN ACT to regulate the use of Songo Lock by steamboats, motor boats or other boats.

### Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

Section 1. It shall be unlawful for any person in charge

- 2 of any steamboat, motor boat or other boat, unless engaged
- 3 in making regular daily trips through Songo Lock carrying
- 4 freight or passengers for hire, or in carrying the United
- 5 States mail, to enter said Songo Lock with any such steam-
- 6 boat, motor boat or other boat at times when by so entering
- 7 said lock other boats carrying the United States mail, or
- 8 making regular daily trips through said lock carrying
- 9 freight or passengers for hire, will thereby be unreasonably

10 delayed; provided, however, such person has been duly
11 notified by the tender of said lock not to enter said Songo
12 Lock until such regular freight, passenger or mail boat has
13 passed through, and provided, however, that this act shall
14 not apply to steamboats, motor boats or other boats, con15 veying officers of the law or physicians on official or pro16 fessional duty.

Section 2. Whoever violates any provision of this act 2 shall forfeit to the State twenty-five dollars and costs for 3 each offense.
