STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND NINE
HUNDRED AND THIRTEEN.

AN ACT to authorize Kingman Lumber Company to build and maintain piers and booms in Madawamkeag and Molunkus Rivers.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

Section 1. The Kingman Lumber Co., a corporation organized and existing under the laws of Maine, its successors and assigns, are hereby authorized and empowered to locate, erect and maintain in Madawamkeag river between a point opposite the station of the Maine Central Railroad in Kingman and the mouth of the Molunkus river on said river in said town of Kingman in the County of Penobscot, piers and booms for the purpose of collecting, holding, sorting

9 and storing logs and other lumber in said Madawamkeag
10 river, that belong to said company or may be intended for
11 use, shipment, sale or manufacture at the mills of the said
12 company.

Section 2. Said Kingman Lumber Company is hereby
2 authorized and empowered to maintain holding booms ex-
3 tending from the foot of Oxbow Island in the Molunkus
4 stream to the head of said island occupying the west chan-
5 nel of said Oxbow and also a holding boom extending
6 across the mouth of the Webster Lagoon or Cove on the
7 west side of said Molunkus stream for the purpose of col-
8 lecting, holding, sorting and storing logs and other lumber
9 in said Molunkus stream that belong to said company or
10 may be intended for use, shipment, sale or manufacture at
11 the mills of said company.

Section 3. Said piers and booms shall be so located, con-
2 structed, used and maintained as not to unreasonably ob-
3 struct the common use of said Madawamkeag and Molun-
4 kus rivers, or to unreasonably delay logs or lumber coming
5 or being driven down said rivers and destined for use,
6 manufacture, shipment or sale at points below the mills of
7 said lumber company.

Section 4. Said Kingman Lumber Company, its success-
2 ors and assigns are hereby authorized and empowered to
3 collect, hold, sort and store logs and other lumber owned by
4 said Kingman Lumber Company, or destined for use, sale,
5 manufacture or shipment at the mills of said Kingman

6 Lumber Company, by, with and at said piers and booms
7 from all logs and other lumber in said Madawamkeag and
8 Molunkus rivers, owned by other parties and destined for
9 use, manufacture or sale at points other than the mills of
10 said company, and said company is also authorized and
11 empowered to hold within the piers and booms mentioned
12 in this act all logs and other lumber coming down either of
13 said rivers, which are destined or intended for use, sale,
14 manufacture or shipment at the mills of said company.

Section 5. The collecting, holding, sorting and storing
2 authorized in Section four of this Act shall be so managed,
3 performed and done as not to unreasonably interfere, ob-
4 struct or delay logs or lumber of other parties destined for
5 other points than the mills of the said Kingman Lumber
6 Company. All sorting authorized by this Act shall be done
7 at the sole charge and expense of said Kingman Lumber
8 Company and any log owner whose logs shall be sorted by
9 said Kingman Lumber Company shall have the right to
10 appoint an agent to see that said sorting is properly done
11 and the reasonable expense of said agent shall be paid by
12 the said Kingman Lumber Company, its successors and
13 assigns.
