STATE OF MAINE

RESOLVE in favor of Greeley Institute.

Resolved, That there be paid to the trustees of Greeley
2 Institute the sum of five hundred dollars (\$500) for the
3 use and benefit of said Institute in carrying on its educa-
4 tional work.

STATEMENT OF FACTS.

Greeley Institute cannot receive State aid from the general academy fund for the year ending July 1, 1913, because of certain technical points in the law. The institution is applying for incorporation and these technicalities will have been removed if such legislation is enacted. The Institute is of approved secondary grade and is meeting the general requirements of a school of its class. The purpose of this resolve is to give the amount of the aid that would be forthcoming from the general academy fund if the technical points relating to incorporation did not exist.
