STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND NINE HUNDRED AND THIRTEEN.

AN ACT to facilitate the Identification of Criminals.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

Section 1. Any officer, or any keeper of a prison, lock-up

- 2 or other place of detention, having in custody any prisoner,
- 3 suspicious person or lodger, may if deemed advisable, meas-
- 4 ure and describe, or cause such person to be measured and
- 5 described in accordance with the system commonly known
- 6 as the Bertillon method for the identification of criminals,
- 7 and in addition may take or have taken such photographs
- 8 as are deemed necessary, and also may take copies of the
- 9 finger-prints of such person, in accordance with the finger-

10 print system for the identification of criminals.

Sect. 2. This act shall take effect upon its passage, and 2 all acts and parts of acts inconsistent with its provisions are 3 hereby repealed.
