IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND NINE
HUNDRED AND THIRTEEN.

RESOLVE in favor of National aid for the Improvement
of Postal Roads.

Whereas the national government has set aside ten thou-
2 sand dollars to be expended on about fifty miles of road in
3 the State which is used by rural delivery mail carriers, on
4 condition that there be raised an additional sum of twenty
5 thousand dollars, the two amounts together to constitute a
6 joint fund of at least thirty thousand dollars for the im-
7 provement of said fifty miles of road, therefore be it
8 Resolved, That there be and is hereby appropriated the
9 sum of twenty thousand dollars for said purpose, that the
10 same be expended under the direction of the State highway
11 department in so far as the same shall not be inconsistent

12 with the act of Congress relating thereto. The roads to be
13 improved by said joint fund shall begin in the town of
14 Fryeburg and extend through the towns of Bridgton,
15 Naples, Casco, Raymond, Windham and the city of West-
16 brook to the Portland line near Riverton, so-called, in said
17 Portland. If the above named route shall conflict with
18 any ruling of the postmaster general or secretary of agri-
19 culture of the United States, the said highway department
20 is hereby authorized to designate such other road or roads
21 as shall meet the requirements of said Postmaster general
22 or secretary of agriculture.
