STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND NINE HUNDRED AND THIRTEEN.

AN ACT to amend the charter and rights of the Goodall Worsted Company.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:
Section I. The Goodall Worsted Company, a corporation
2 existing under the general laws of the state of Maine, is
3 hereby authorized and empowered to carry on the following
4 business, in addition to those named in its certificate of
5 organization.

Sect. 2. To manufacture, buy, sell and deal in wool and 2 all animal and vegetable fibres and products.

Sect. 3. To develop any water power now or hereafter 2 owned by said company on the Mousam river, in the coun-

3 ty of York, and acquire and maintain auxiliary power plants, 4 for the purpose of making, generating, selling, distributing, 5 or supplying electricity, for power or lighting purposes, to 6 to be used only in connection with the operation of its mills, 7 storehouses and coal pockets or the use of concerns or in-8 dividuals occupying its mills, storehouses and coal pockets, 9 as tenants under lease.

Said company for the purposes of this act is hereby au-11 thorized to issue bonds from time to time, and to secure 12 the same by appropriate mortgage of such of its property 13 and franchise as its stockholders may vote at any annual 14 or special meeting, providing the subject matter is fully 15 stated in the call for the meeting.

Sect. 4. Said company is hereby authorized to set poles 2 and wires thereon, in and through any street, road and way 3 from its power plant or plants to its mill or mills, store-4 houses and coal pockets, all subject to the same rights and 5 liabilities incident to similar corporations as fixed by the 6 general statutes relating thereto.

Sect. 5. To purchase or otherwise acquire real estate, 2 lumber, or interests therein that may be beneficial to the 3 company. To hold, develop, improve, sell or otherwise dis-4 pose of any lands or property belonging to the company 5 or in which the company is interested.

Sect. 6. To own and operate saw mills, and to manu-2 facture lumber; to manufacture, mold and build machinery 3 of all kinds of whatever material.

Sect. 7. To own in whole or in part, or to operate, char-2 ter, hire, use and lease freight vessels of any description 3 to carry on the business of freight upon the high seas, to 4 or from any port or ports in Maine to any other domestic 5 port or ports.

Sect. 8. To carry on any mercantile or other business in-2 cidental to the ownership, operation or development of its 3 property or any that it may acquire.
