STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND NINE
HUNDRED AND THIRTEEN.

AN ACT amending Section 37, chapter 28 of the Revised
Statutes, relating to the protection of life in buildings used
for public purposes.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

Section 1. Section 37 of chapter 28 of the Revised Stat-
utes is hereby amended by striking out in the third line
thereof the word "inner"; also by striking out the following
sentence: "The outer doors of all such buildings shall be
kept open when the same are used by the public, unless they
open outwards; but fly-doors opening both ways may be
kept closed," so that said section as amended shall read as
follows:

'Sect. 37. Every building intended temporarily or permanently for public use, and every schoolhouse of more than one story in height, and every schoolroom therein, shall have all doors, intended for egress, open outwards.'
