RESOLVE in favor of D. C. Skillin, secretary of the Committee of the State School for Boys and the Industrial School for Girls.

Resolved, That there be and hereby is appropriated the
2 sum of forty-four dollars and ninety-five cents (\$44.95)
3 to be paid to D. C. Skillin, secretary of the Committee of
4 the State School for Boys and the Industrial School for
5 Girls, for expense incurred in taking the committee to visit
6 the State School for Boys at South Portland.

STATEMENT OF FACTS.

On Friday, January 17, 1913, the members of the Joint Standing Committee on State School for Boys and Industrial School for Girls visited the State School for Boys at South Portland on official business. Mr. Skillin, the secretary of the committee, purchased tickets and paid hotel bills, a total of \$44.95.
