STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND NINE  
HUNDRED AND THIRTEEN.

AN ACT relating to payment to minors under decree of court.

---

*Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:*

Section 1. Whenever, under any decree or order of the  
2 supreme judicial court of this state, or of any justice there-  
3 of, in term time or in vacation, or of any judge of any  
4 probate court in this state, any receiver, master, executor,  
5 administrator, trustee, guardian, or other person acting un-  
6 der authority of either of said courts, or any justice or judge  
7 thereof, shall have in his hands any funds not exceeding  
8 one hundred dollars to be distributed or paid to any person  
9 under the age of twenty-one years, not having a guardian

10 legally appointed in this state, payment may be made direct  
11 to such minor, and such minor's receipt therefor shall be  
12 a sufficient voucher for such payment in the settlement in  
13 court of any account by the party who makes such payment,  
14 and shall discharge and release him from any and all fur-  
15 ther liability on account of the same. Provided, however,  
16 that such person paying the same may in his discretion re-  
17 quire on such receipt the counter signature of one or both  
18 of the parents of such minor, or if neither parent be living,  
19 may withhold payment until further order of court, or until  
20 the appointment of a guardian.
