STATE OF MAINE

RESOLVE in favor of the Trustees of Bridgton Academy.

Resolved, That there be and hereby is appropriated in
2 favor of the trustees of Bridgton academy the sum of five
3 hundred dollars for the year nineteen hundred thirteen and
4 the sum of five hundred dollars for the year nineteen hun-
5 dred fourteen, said sums to be expended under the direc-
6 tion of said trustees for the purpose of repairing the build-
7 ings of Bridgton academy at North Bridgton in the county
8 of Cumberland.

STATEMENT OF FACTS.

The buildings of Bridgton Academy are generally old and have been in need of repairs for many years, but as the entire available funds each year were used for the maintenance of the teaching force little has been obtainable for repairs. The past year with more courage the trustees have newly roofed Ingalls Hall, but as it cost over \$400 they are crippled to pay running expenses and must stop repairs unless the State assists. The academy's only recitation building was erected in 1825 and is in sore need of a basement with heat, water, lights and a laboratory equipment. These items alone will cost about \$2000. The chapel is in danger from defective foundations which must be relaid. This with new roof will cost not less than \$500. It also needs electric wiring at a cost of \$200. Both buildings were last painted in 1890 and should be repainted at once at a cost of \$300. The girls' dormitory—nearly new—must have a new gravel roof, for which Holivan & Parker of Portland have estimated the cost at \$478.
