Resolved, That there be and hereby is appropriated the

#### STATEMENT OF FACTS.

To reimburse the hospital for moneys paid out of hospital treasury for interest paid on borrowed money and for renovation of building disallowed by State Auditors as expended without authority of law.

The Trustees were obliged by the straitened condition of the State Treasury in 1910 and 1911 to borrow money in order to meet the immediate current liabilities and pay roll, as not one cent of the appropriation for 1910 was received from the State Treasury until July 22d, 1910, and then only \$25,000. \$100,000 was received in October, 1910, and notes were paid. January 1st, 1911, nearly \$100,000 of the appropriation for 1910 was due and was not received by the Treasurer of the hospital until April 8th, 1911; hence why interest was necessarily paid on overdue accounts.

Reimbursement of this asset necessary to make good and restore the capital of the hospital as it was when the State took over the full burden of support of the Maine Insane Hospital January 1st, 1910.
