# STATE OF MAINE

### IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND NINE HUNDRED AND THIRTEEN.

AN ACT to appropriate moneys for the expenditures of government for the year one thousand nine hundred and thirteen.

Whereas, the appropriation of moneys for the maintenance of the several branches of the state government and its institutions is an emergency measure immediately necessary for the preservation of the public peace, health or safety, now, therefore,

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:
Section I. In order to provide for the several acts and
2 resolves of the legislature requiring the payment of moneys
3 from the state treasury, and also to provide in part for the

4 necessary expenditures of government, for the current fiscal 5 year one thousand nine hundred and thirteen, the following 6 sums are hereby appropriated out of any moneys in the 7 state treasury, and except where otherwise specially pro-8 vided, the governor with the advice of the council, is hereby 9 authorized at any time prior to the first day of July, one 10 thousand nine hundred and fourteen, to draw his warrant 11 on the state treasurer for the same.
