STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND NINE
HUNDRED AND THIRTEEN.

AN ACT to compel the printing of all State papers and documents under proper sanitary conditions.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

Section 1. On and after July 30th, 1913, all printing for
2 all the state departments and institutions of the state of
3 Maine and all other printing, including the state paper, shall
4 be performed in printing shops complying with the rules and
5 regulations as to sanitation and hours of labor laid down by
6 the International Typographical Union.

The state auditor shall not authorize payment for, nor shall
8 the head of any department or institution certify to the au-

9 ditor for payment bills for any report, blank document, pam-
10 phlet, bulletin or other printing of any kind, that does not
11 bear the stamp of said International Typographical Union,
12 as evidence that the sanitary and labor conditions required
13 by the rules of that organization have been complied with.
