SENATE AMENDMENT C TO HOUSE DOCUMENT NO. 210.

Section 4. Whereas, the foregoing act forbids the wear2 ing of charms, and whereas the charms of women affect the
3 public peace, particularly the peace of mind of all men
4 (and women of less charms); and whereas many men while
5 suffering from said charms pine away in health, and others
6 engage in personal combats to the great danger of the
7 safety of their fellow men; and whereas those charms are
8 likely to be concealed by fair women wearing automobile
9 goggles from Kittery to Bar Harbor, and young men may
10 have their attentions diverted to the "stream of yellow gold"

11 rather than to those virtuous and consecrated unions which 12 multiply the race and tend to the "general welfare" of all 13 mankind;

And whereas, all of said causes constitute in the mind of 15 the legislature a great public emergency, involving the 16 public peace, health and safety of the Dirigo State of Maine,

Therefore, this act shall take effect instantly, notwith-18 standing the Constitution.
