## STATE OF MAINE

RESOLVE in favor of the Old Town-Orono Anti-Tuberculosis

Association of Old Town.

Resolved, That the sum of one hundred dollars for the year

- 2 nineteen hundred thirteen, and the sum of one hundred dol-
- 3 lars for the year nineteen hundred fourteen be and hereby
- 4 is appropriated to be paid to the Old Town-Orono Anti-
- 5 Tuberculosis Association on account of treatment to be ren-
- 6 dered by said association to the Penobscot tribe of Indians.



#### STATEMENT OF FACTS.

The Old Town-Orono Anti-Tuberculosis Association is a voluntary association maintained by the citizens of Old Town and Orono by subscription.

The association maintains a free dispensary where medical attention and supplies are given gratuitously to those afflicted with tuberculosis, who are unable to pay. A district nurse is also employed to give advice and instruction free of charge. Within the field of work of this association lives the Penobscot tribe of Indians, members of which are afflicted with tuberculosis. This appropriation is for the use of the said association on account of medical advice and attention which will be given to such members of the tribe as may need. The Indians are about the streets of Old Town daily and must have supervision if the fight against tuberculosis is to be successful.
