#### STATE OF MAINE

RESOLVE in favor of Holy Innocents' Home for Infants, Portland.

- 3 Home for Infants, Portland, for the year nineteen hundred
- 4 and thirteen and two thousand dollars for the year nineteen
- 5 hundred and fourteen, for maintenance.
