STATE OF MAINE

RESOLVE in favor of Survey for Road in Towns of Amherst
and Clifton.

Resolved, That there be and hereby is appropriated the sum
2 of one hundred and fifty dollars (\$150) for the purpose of
3 making a survey for a road in the vicinity of Chick Hill and
4 Rebel Hill, so-called, in the town of Amherst in Hancock
5 county and the town of Clifton in Penobscot county; said
6 appropriation to be expended, and said survey to be made,
7 by the State highway department.

STATEMENT OF FACTS.

It is not deemed advisable by the Committee on Ways and Bridges to recommend the appropriation asked for in the original resolve, but it recognizes the desirability of avoiding, if feasible, the heavy grades of the present highway over Chick Hill. Therefore the committee is of the opinion that a survey should be made to ascertain if some practicable route may not be located and for the expense of such survey the sum named in the resolve is recommended.
