STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND NINE
HUNDRED AND THIRTEEN.

AN ACT to create the office of Assistant Attorney General.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

Section 1. The attorney general shall appoint a deputy
2 who shall be designated as assistant attorney general, and
3 who shall serve during the pleasure of the attorney general
4 or until a successor is duly appointed and qualified. His
5 office shall be at the Capitol and he may perform all the
6 duties required of the attorney general by chapter forty-
7 seven of the Revised Statutes and such other duties as the
8 attorney general may require of him. He shall receive an
9 annual salary of eighteen hundred dollars and actual cash
10 expenses while in the discharge of his duties away from the
11 Capitol and he shall receive no further fees, perquisites or
12 emoluments.
