SENATE AMENDMENT "E" TO SENATE DOCUMENT
NO. 575.

Amend section 11 of Senate Document No. 575 by striking out lines 1 to 24 inclusive and inserting in place thereof the following:

'Sect. 11. A commission is hereby created to be known as the Industrial Accident Commission of the State of Maine, and it shall consist of three members, which commission shall be vested with and possessed of all the powers and duties specified in this act and who shall be severally sworn to the faithful performance of their duties and shall hold office for the term of three years or until their suc-

cessors respectively shall be appointed and qualified to act.
Within ten days after this act becomes law the governor
by and with the advice and consent of the council shall ap-
point three such persons to be members of the Industrial
Accident Commission of Maine; one to hold office for one
year, one to hold office for two years and a chairman to
hold office for three years, and any member of said com-
mission for wilful neglect of duty or for malfeasance in
office may after notice and hearing be removed from office
by the governor and council. In case of a vacancy occur-
ring through death, resignation or removal the governor
shall with the advice and consent of the council appoint a
successor for the term of three years subject to removal,
as aforesaid. Such chairman shall receive a salary of \$2500
per year and the other members of the commission shall
receive a salary of \$1500 per year. The members of said
commission shall also receive their traveling expenses actu-
ally and necessarily incurred in the performance of their
duties.'
