STATE OF MAINE

RESOLVE authorizing the Land Agent to investigate the cuttings of lumber on the Public Lots, in the County of Aroostook.

---

The Assessors of Reed Plantation and of Glenwood Plantation, in the County of Aroostook, complain that the Land Agent permitted the cutting of logs on the Public Lots, in said plantations, and had no one interested in the school fund to look after the cutting; that the parties who held the permits paid stumpage on much less than was actually cut. They also complain that they requested the Land Agent to employ counters to ascertain the number of logs actually cut, which he neglected to do.

*Wherefore, be it Resolved, That the Land Agent is hereby*  
2 empowered and directed to employ competent surveyors of

3 lumber to examine the cuttings of lumber on the school  
4 lands, in said plantations, and all other school lands in  
5 Aroostook county, where operations have been made, with-  
6 in the past six years; and said report shall be filed by the  
7 Land Agent with the Governor as soon as said investiga-  
8 tions can be made.

*And be it further Resolved,* That the Governor, with the  
10 consent of the Council, be and is hereby authorized to pay  
11 the actual expense, which may be incurred by this investi-  
12 gation, such payment to be made from any unexpended  
13 money in the treasury.
