STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND NINE HUNDRED AND THIRTEEN.

AN ACT to amend Section fifteen of Chapter eight of the Revised Statutes, relating to the Board of State Assessors.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

Section 1. Section fifteen of chapter eight of the Revised

- 2 Statutes is hereby amended by adding after the word "as-
- 3 sistance" in the third line the words 'in addition to a clerk,'
- 4 so that said section shall read as follows:

'Sect. 15. They shall be provided with suitable rooms in

6 the state house, and shall be furnished by the secretary of

7 state with necessary books, blanks, stationery, notices and

8 summonses, and may employ assistance in addition to a

9 clerk as they shall deem necessary at an expense not ex-10 ceeding one thousand dollars a year.'

STATEMENT OF FACTS.

Chapter 159, Laws of 1905, fixes the salary of the clerk of the Board of State Assessors at \$1200, but the extra work created by the Laws of 1905, has required an extra clerk for the past eight years. This amount has been taken from the resolve providing for exploration and description of wild lands.

The accompanying bill makes the extra clerk hire a separate item, but does not create an extra expense.
