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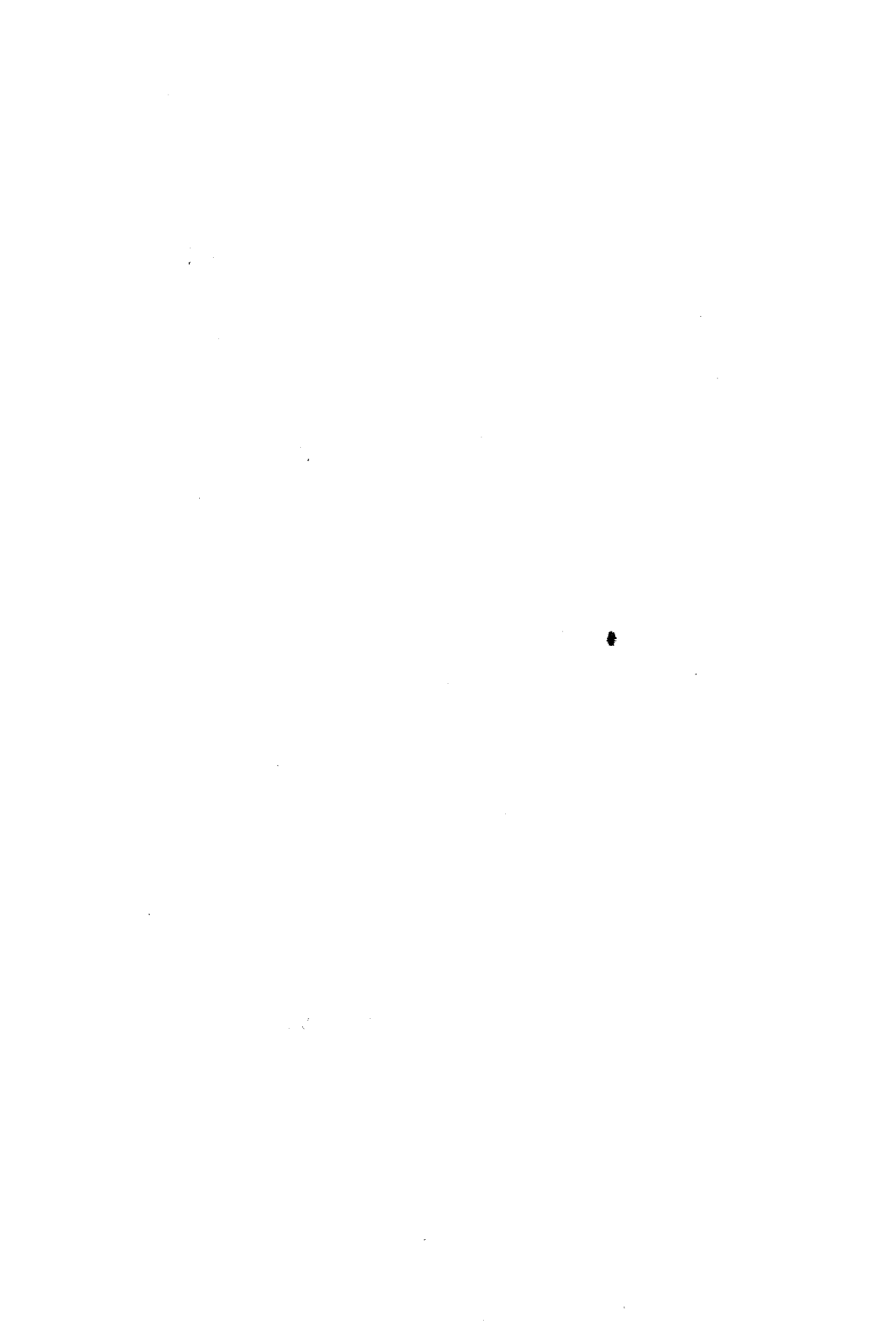
STATE OF MAINE

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RESOLVE in favor of the Clerk Stenographer and the Messenger to the Judiciary Committee.

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*Resolved,* That there be appropriated and paid to Ralph  
2 E. Mason the sum of five hundred dollars for services as  
3 clerk to the Judiciary Committee; and that there be appro-  
4 priated and paid to Helen M. Nye the sum of one hundred  
5 and fifty dollars for services as stenographer to said com-  
6 mittee, and ten dollars for rental of typewriter; and that  
7 there be appropriated and paid to Percy F. Crane the sum  
8 of one hundred and fifty dollars for services as messenger  
9 to said committee.



### STATEMENT OF FACTS.

At the opening of the Seventy-sixth Legislature the Judiciary Committee duly appointed Ralph E. Mason clerk, Helen M. Nye stenographer, and Percy F. Crane messenger to said committee. Having been in attendance throughout the present session and having duly performed their duties, their compensations for their respective duties have been fixed the same as such duties to said committee at the previous session. A typewriter was rented for the session, three months.
