HOUSE AMENDMENT "A" TO SENATE DOCUMENT
NO. 544.

Amend by striking out the whole of section 5 and inserting 2 in place thereof the following:

'Sect. 5. Section six of said chapter is hereby amended 4 by adding to said section the following: 'Any veterinarian 5 not a graduate, desiring to render professional services for 6 the state of Maine, in any of its departments, shall at the 7 request of the Live Stock Sanitary Commissioner, submit 8 himself to an examination before said board of examiners 9 as to his fitness to perform the service.' So that said sec- 10 tion when amended shall read as follows:

‘Sect. 6. The board of examiners shall issue certificates
12 to all persons qualified to receive them under the provisions
13 of section four and to all persons passing the examination
14 required under section five, authorizing the holder to prac-
15 tice veterinary surgery, medicine, or dentistry, or any branch
16 thereof, within the state. Said certificate shall be recorded
17 in the office of the clerk of the supreme judicial court in
18 the county wherein the holder resides at the time of pass-
19 ing said examination. Said clerk shall be entitled to a fee
20 of fifty cents for making such record and in the absence
21 of the original certificate an attested copy of such record
22 shall be received as evidence in all courts within the state
23 of the right of the person therein named to practice vet-
24 erinary surgery, medicine, or dentistry, or any branch there-
25 of, within the state. Any veterinarian not a graduate de-
26 siring to render professional services for the state of Maine,
27 in any of its departments, shall at the request of the Live
28 Stock Sanitary Commissioner, submit himself to an exam-
29 ination before said board of examiners as to his fitness to
30 perform the service.’
