MEMORIAL TO CONGRESS FROM THE SEVENTY-
SIXTH LEGISLATURE OF MAINE PROTESTING
AGAINST THE PUTTING ON THE FREE LIST THE
AGRICULTURAL PRODUCTS AND MANUFAC-
TURED GOODS OF THE STATE.

The Senate and House of Representatives of the State of Maine assembled in the Seventy-sixth Legislature respectfully protest to the Congress of the United States against putting on the free list agricultural products grown in this State, also lumber manufactured in this State, also all goods manufactured in

this State as the putting of these articles upon the free list would result in irreparable injury to the people of our State and we call upon our Senators and Representatives in Congress to do all in their power to avoid such injury to our people.

Resolved, that a copy of this Memorial attested by the Secretary of the Senate and Clerk of the House be forwarded to our Senators and Representatives in Congress.
