STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND NINE HUNDRED AND FIFTEEN

AN ACT to amend Chapter 359 of the Private and Special Laws of the State of Maine for the year 1897.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:
Section I. Section 3 of chapter 359 of the private and
2 special laws for the year 1897 is hereby amended by strik3 ing therefrom the sentence: "All paupers now supported
4 or aided by the town of Deer Isle, and all persons that may
5 hereafter fall in distress or become paupers, shall, after the
6 approval of this act, be maintained and supported by the
7 town in whose territory they reside when they become pau8 pers;" and by substituting therefor the following: "The

9 settlement of all paupers shall be determined in accordance 10 with the general law relating thereto.'

Sect. 2. Said section is further amended by striking there-2 from the sentence: "All expense for support and maintenance 3 of minors under the laws of the state, committed to the in-4 dustrial and reform schools, shall henceforth be borne by 5 the town in whose territory they resided at the time of their 6 arrest or commitment."

Sect. 3. Said section as amended shall read as follows: 2 'The existing liabilities and obligations of the town of Deer 3 Isle shall be divided as follows: The town debt, if any, 4 shall be borne by said towns in proportion to the valuation 5 of their respective territories, as taken by the assessors in 6 April, eighteen hundred and ninety-six; and they shall con-7 tinue to pay the same proportion of the state and county 8 taxes assessed upon the present town of Deer Isle, until a o separate valuation shall be made by the state assessors. 10 The settlement of all paupers shall be determined in accord-11 ance with the geenral law relating thereto. Except those 12 now supported in the insane asylum, the support of whom 13 shall be borne by the two towns in proportion to their re-14 spective valuation. Each town shall henceforth bear all 15 expenses for the support of schools and the care and main-16 tenance of all roads and bridges within their respective 17 limits.'

Sect. 4. Said section 3 as now amended shall apply in all2 cases of pauper settlement as though it had been the original3 reading of said section.

Sect. 5. Said act shall take effect when approved.
