STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND NINE
HUNDRED AND FIFTEEN

AN ACT to amend Chapter one hundred and thirty of the Public Laws of nineteen hundred and thirteen, to provide for a more equitable distribution of funds for state aid roads.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

Chapter one hundred and thirty of the Public Laws of 2 nineteen hundred and thirteen, and known as the High- 3 way Commission Act, is hereby amended by striking out 4 the second paragraph of section nineteen of said chapter 5 and substituting therefor the following:

“Towns having a valuation of two hundred thousand dollars 7 or less may appropriate any amount not exceeding three 8 hundred dollars; towns having a valuation of over two

9 hundred thousand dollars and not over five hundred thou-
10 sand dollars, may appropriate any amount not exceeding
11 four hundred and fifty dollars; towns having a valuation of
12 over five hundred thousand dollars and not over eight hun-
13 dred thousand dollars may appropriate any amount not
14 exceeding five hundred and fifty dollars; towns having a
15 valuation of over eight hundred thousand dollars and not
16 over one million dollars may appropriate any amount not
17 exceeding six hundred and fifty dollars; towns having a
18 valuation of over one million dollars and not over one mil-
19 lion two hundred thousand dollars may appropriate any
20 amount not exceeding seven hundred and twenty-five dol-
21 lars; towns having a valuation of over one million two
22 hundred thousand dollars and not over one million six hun-
23 dred thousand dollars may appropriate any amount not ex-
24 ceeding eight hundred dollars; towns having a valuation of
25 over one million six hundred thousand dollars and not over
26 three million dollars may appropriate in addition to the sum
27 of eight hundred dollars, sixty-six dollars for each two
28 hundred thousand dollars or fraction thereof in excess of
29 one million six hundred thousand dollars; towns having a
30 valuation of over three million dollars and not over four
31 million dollars may appropriate not exceeding one thousand
32 three hundred and thirty-three dollars; and towns having
33 a valuation of over four million dollars may appropriate in
34 addition to the sum of one thousand three hundred and thir-

35 ty-three dollars, an additional sum not exceeding one hun-
36 dred and thirty-three dollars for each additional one mil-
37 lion dollars of additional valuation.'
