STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND NINE
HUNDRED AND FIFTEEN

AN ACT in Favor of the Union of the Towns of Dover and
Foxcroft as one Municipality.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

Section 1. The towns of Dover and Foxcroft in the
2 County of Piscataquis in said state, together with that por-
3 tion of what was formerly the northeast part of Sanger-
4 ville which lies north of the Piscataquis River, now not a
5 part of any town, are hereby united together in one munici-
6 pality by the name of Dover-Foxcroft, which is hereby
7 vested with all the powers, privileges and immunities which
8 the inhabitants of towns within this state do or may enjoy.

Sect. 2. All the liabilities of both said towns at the time this act takes effect are hereby assumed by and become the liabilities of said town of Dover-Foxcroft.

Sect. 3. All the property, both real and personal, owned by either or both of said towns of Dover and Foxcroft at the time this act shall take effect is hereby conveyed to and becomes the property of said new town of Dover-Foxcroft.

Sect. 4. The collectors of taxes for both towns at the time this act shall take effect shall collect and pay over to the treasurer of said new town of Dover-Foxcroft all taxes they shall have been directed to pay to the treasurers of their respective towns which shall have been then assessed and committed to said collectors for collection, not then already collected and paid over to the treasurers of their respective towns.

Sect. 5. The treasurers of both said towns at the time this act shall take effect shall pay over all moneys, and deliver all books, papers, and documents pertaining to their respective offices, to the treasurer of the new town of Dover-Foxcroft.

Sect. 6. The town clerks of both said towns shall deliver to the town clerk of the new town of Dover-Foxcroft all records and books belonging to their respective towns, and all papers, records and documents belonging to their respective offices.

Sect. 7. The selectmen, assessors and overseers of the
2 poor of both said towns shall deliver all books, papers and
3 documents belonging to their several offices respectively to
4 the selectmen of the new town of Dover-Foxcroft.

Sect. 8. The said new town of Dover-Foxcroft shall be
2 and remain the shire town of said county and all writs, pre-
3 cepts, processes, actions and matters pending at the time this
4 act shall take effect, returnable to any of the several courts
5 at said Dover, shall be entered, acted upon and disposed of
6 the same as though they had been made returnable to any
7 court at Dover-Foxcroft.

Sect. 9. This act shall take effect on the first day of
2 March next succeeding the date when both said towns shall
3 have severally voted to accept the provisions of this act at
4 meetings legally called and held by warrants containing
5 articles for that purpose.
