STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND NINE HUNDRED AND FIFTEEN

AN ACT relating to holidays.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:
Section I. Section 88 of Chapter 15 of the Revised Stat2 utes of the State of Maine as amended by Section I of
3 Chapter 190 of the Public Laws of 1909 is hereby amended
4 by inserting after the words, "The following days shall be
5 observed as school holidays," the following: 'And as holi6 days in every manufacturing establishment of this state,' so
7 that said section as amended shall read as follows:

'Sect. 88. The following days shall be observed as school 9 holidays and as holidays in every manufacturing establish-10 ment of this state, namely: New Year's day, January one;

11 Washington's birthday, February twenty-two; Patriot's 12 day, April nineteen; Memorial day, May thirty; Independ-13 ence day, July four; Labor day, first Monday in Septem-14 ber; Christmas day, December twenty-five; Thanksgiving 15 and Arbor days as appointed by Governor and Council. 16 Provided, however, that Arbor day shall not be recognized 17 as a school holiday, unless observed by teacher and pupils 18 for the purpose for which it is designated by the Governor 19 and Council. All teachers of public schools in the state may 20 close their schools on the days above mentioned and draw 21 pay the same as if their schools had been in session upon 22 those days. When any one of the above named holidays 23 falls on a Sunday, the Monday following shall be observed 24 as a school holiday, and as holidays in every manufacturing 25 establishment of this State, with all the privileges applying 26 to any of the days above named. February twelve shall be 27 observed by the teachers and pupils in all the public schools 28 of the state as Lincoln day, some part of which day, as far 29 as may be expedient, shall be devoted to the study of the 30 life and character of Abraham Lincoln. When Lincoln day 31 falls on a Saturday or Sunday the observance of the same 32 shall be as above stated on the following Monday.'

Sect. 2. All acts and parts of acts inconsistent herewith 2 are hereby repealed.
