IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND NINE
HUNDRED AND FIFTEEN

AN ACT to Provide for a Closed Time on Bull Moose.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

Section 1. No person shall, within four years from November first, in the year of our Lord nineteen hundred and fifteen, hunt, chase, catch, kill or have in possession any bull moose or part thereof.

Sect. 2. Whoever violates any provision of this act shall be punished by a fine not exceeding five hundred dollars, or by imprisonment not exceeding four months, for each bull moose taken, caught, killed or had in possession in violation of any provision of this act. Whoever has any part

6 of a bull moose in possession in violation of this act shall
7 be subject to the same penalty.

Sect. 3. All acts or parts of acts inconsistent with this
2 act are hereby repealed.
