STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND NINE HUNDRED AND FIFTEEN

AN ACT to prohibit the fishing for herring in Sheepscot river and its tributaries, by use of purse or drag seines.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:
Section 1. No person shall use any purse or drag seines,
2 or any other seines or nets, in fishing for herring in the
3 following waters: In Sheepscot river north of a line drawn
4 from Rowe's wharf at Five Islands in the town of George5 town to Dog Fish head in the town of Southport, in Robin6 hood's cove, Montweag bay, Knubble bay, Back river, and
7 all bays, coves and channels between Boothbay Harbor and
8 the Kennebec river, including Ebenecook harbor and the
9 channel between Barter island and the main land, known as

10 Back river, Parsons creek, Cross river, Oven's Mouth river 11 and its tributaries.

Whoever violates the provisions of this act shall be liable 13 to a fine of not exceeding five hundred dollars for each of-14 fence, to be recovered by complaint, indictment or action of 15 debt.

This act shall not prevent the use of seines or nets in traps 17 by the owners or persons in charge of such traps.
