STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND NINE HUNDRED AND FIFTEEN

AN ACT relative to Untrue and Misleading Advertisements.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

Any person, firm, corporation or association who, with 2 intent to sell or in any wise dispose of merchandise, se-3 curities, service, or anything offered by such person, firm,

- 4 corporation or association, directly or indirectly, to the
- 5 public for sale or distribution, or with intent to increase
- 6 the consumption thereof, or to induce the public in any
- 7 manner to enter into any obligations relating thereto, or to
- 8 acquire title thereto, or any interest therein, makes, pub-
- 9 lishes, disseminates, circulates, or places before the public,

or causes, directly or indirectly, to be made, published, disseminated, circulated or placed before the public, in a newspaper or other publication, or in the form of a book, notice, handbill, poster, bill, circular, phamphlet, or letter, or in any other way, an advertisement of any sort regarding mersor chandise, securities, service, or anything so offered to the public, which advertisement contains any assertion, representation or statement of fact which is untrue, deceptive or misleading, shall be punished by a fine of not less than the twenty dollars nor more than one thousand dollars, or by imprisonment for not less than thirty days nor more than two years, or by both such fine and imprisonment.
