STATE OF MAINE

RESOLVE, in Favor of Repair of Highway in Caratunk
Plantation.

Resolved, That there be and hereby is appropriated the
2 sum of five hundred dollars (\$500) for the year 1915 to
3 aid Caratunk Plantation in improving the road in said Cara-
4 tunk commonly known as the Pleasant Pond Road leading
5 from the store of Albert Clark on the main River Road in
6 Caratunk Village to the hotel of James Martin on the shore
7 of Pleasant Pond, provided said Caratunk Plantation ap-
8 propriates the like sum of five hundred dollars (\$500) for
9 the same purpose; both sums to be expended under the
10 direction of the State Highway Department.

STATEMENT OF FACTS.

This is a narrow, crooked "dugway" road leading from Caratunk village to Pleasant Pond a distance of $3\frac{1}{2}$ miles. Pleasant Pond is a well established summer resort frequented by people from all parts of Maine and has many visitors from other states. Caratunk has a valuation of \$127,000, population of 235, and more roads and bridges than it is able to properly maintain.
