STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND NINE
HUNDRED AND FIFTEEN

AN ACT to amend section twelve of chapter two hundred and twenty-seven of the Private and Special Laws of nineteen hundred and eleven relating to voting in Bayville Village Corporation.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

Section twelve of chapter two hundred and twenty-seven
2 of the private and special laws of nineteen hundred and
3 eleven is amended by striking out the words "and occupies"
4 in the third line, all of the fourth, fifth, sixth, and seventh
5 lines and the words "are present" in the eighth line, and
6 inserting in place thereof the following: 'one or more lots

7 of land within the limits of said corporation shall be legal
8 voters at any meeting at which they are present, provided,
9 however, that no person shall be entitled to more than one
10 vote. In cases where there is joint ownership of lot or
11 lots the owners may select one person to act for all the
12 owners,' and by striking out all of said section after the
13 word "voters" in the fourteenth line, so that said section
14 as amended shall read as follows:

'Sect. 12. All persons residing within the limits of said
16 corporation who would be legal voters in the town of Booth-
17 bay Harbor, and every person of lawful age who owns one
18 or more lots of land within the limits of said corporation
19 shall be legal voters at any meeting at which they are pres-
20 ent, provided, however, that no person shall be entitled to
21 more than one vote, and no lot shall be represented by more
22 than one voter. In cases where there is joint ownership
23 of lot or lots, the owners may select one person to act for
24 all the owners. The overseers of the corporation shall de-
25 termine who are the legal voters at any meeting and shall
26 prepare a list of said voters at least twenty-four hours be-
27 fore every meeting, which said list they may amend or
28 correct at any time before said meeting or during its prog-
29 ress. The vote upon any proposition at any meeting shall
30 be taken and checked by this list upon demand of five legal
31 voters.'
