STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND NINE HUNDRED AND FIFTEEN

RESOLVE, in favor of Sibae S. Andrews for increase of pension.

Resolved, That a pension of twelve dollars per month be 2 paid to Sibae S. Andrews, widow of Freeman B. Andrews, 3 late of Oxford, who was a soldier in the Civil War, in 4 place of the amount she is now receiving, the same to take 5 effect January 1, 1915. •

STATEMENT OF FACTS.

Sibae S. Andrews is the widow of the late Freeman B. Andrews, who was a member of the Twenty-seventh Company of Unassigned Infantry, Maine Volunteers, and on account of the closing of the war the company was mustered out before the expiration of ninety days from date of enlistment, thus excluding her from the benefit of a United States pension. Mrs. Andrews is past eighty-one years of age, is very feeble and nearly blind, and what little property she has is mortgaged to its full value. On account of a fall she is very lame in the knee and hip and can only get about the house with difficulty, is unable to earn anything, her only income being the four dollars state pension she is now receiving, which is entirely inadequate for her support.
