STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND NINE HUNDRED AND FIFTEEN

RESOLVE, in favor of the Plantation of Wallagrass.

Resolved, That there be and hereby is appropriated the 2 sum of one thousand dollars (\$1000) for the purpose of 3 aiding in building one additional cement pier and one additional span to iron bridge across the Fish river at Soldier 5 pond in the plantation of Wallagrass, provided the sum of 6 one thousand dollars (\$1000) be appropriated by the plantation of Wallagrass for the same purpose; both sums to be 8 expended under the supervision of the state highway degratment.

STATEMENT OF FACTS.

The Legislature of 1909 appropriated the sum of four thousand dollars for the construction of the above mentioned bridge, and said amount not having been sufficient to build the bridge of sufficient length and one-third of said bridge was built with wooden substruction having been partly knocked or torn down by logs and ice running down said Fish river so that repairs have become necessary. This bridge is on direct thoroughfare from New Canada Plantation and also the main highway called the Fort Kent road, and carries a heavy travel; and the said plantation is unable from its own resources to bear this expense.
