STATE OF MAINE

RESOLVE, in favor of the Plantation of New Canada.

Resolved, That there be and hereby is appropriated the
2 sum of five hundred dollars (\$500.00) to aid in the con-
3 struction of a bridge across Perley brook, so called, in the
4 plantation of New Canada, on the road leading from Fort
5 Kent to Caribou, in the plantation of New Canada, pro-
6 vided there be appropriated by the plantation of New Can-
7 ada, or otherwise, the sum of five hundred dollars (\$500.00)
8 for the same purpose; both sums to be expended under the
9 supervision of the state highway department.

STATEMENT OF FACTS.

The Legislature of 1913 appropriated five hundred dollars (\$500.00) toward the construction of this bridge. Some work has already been done and an expenditure of eleven hundred dollars (\$1100.00) has been made. There remains to be done, to complete the bridge and approaches, work which it is estimated will cost one thousand dollars (\$1,000.00) and the plantation is unable, from its own resources, to bear this expense.

This road is on the direct thoroughfare from Caribou to Fort Kent and carries a heavy travel; most of it, travel which does not originate in the plantation.
